

## **BUOYANCY AID & SAFETY**

In order to ensure the safety of everyone during the event, **each participant must be able to swim at least 25 meters.** 

It is also important that **each participant is aware of the event on-the-water safety instructions** (<a href="https://">https://</a> ibcpcfrance2026.com/wp-content/uploads/2025/04/safety-instructions-ibcpc26.pdf).

For safety reasons and in accordance with the regulations of the French local authorities, **each participant** must have a personal buoyancy aid complying with the international standard ISO-12 402-5 (level 50 / 50 Newton).

However, French government regulations do not allow <u>manual life jackets</u>, <u>automatic life jackets</u> <u>released with a cellulose pill system</u> or <u>any types of buoyancy aid belts</u>. The only type of inflatable life jacket authorised is the one released with the hydrostatic technology (Hammar type). Please see examples on the table below:



<u>Please note:</u> buoyancy aids / life jackets will not be provided for BCS crews and paddlers. <u>You must bring your own</u>. If you have an inflatable automatic hydrostatic life jacket, <u>please make sure the cartridge is armed before each time on the water and have spare cartridges with you in case one needs to be used.</u>

On-site checks will be carried out.
